MEMBERS OF THE KENTUCKY STATE BOARD OF CHARITIES
AND CORRECTIONS.

Gentlemen:—

For a number of years the Chiropractic profession has made claims that there was a very important and very necessary work to be done in the State Penal and Charitable institutions which could be done only by those skilled in the Science and practice of Chiropractic.

Claims have been made that hundreds of thousands of dollars could be saved by the state annually and hundreds of the inmates of these institutions could be rehabilitated to such an extent that they could return to their homes and loved ones and would cease to be wards of the state and instead become useful, producing, healthy and law abiding citizens.

The State Supervisor of Chiropractors was given permission to enter the Kentucky Houses of Reform by the Board of Charities and Corrections September 1st, 1930. On September 3rd, 1930 to December 1st, 1931 we have treated 244 patients. These patients were taken from the boys department. We have submitted a complete report to the Board of Charities and Corrections each three months. Each quarterly report has been submitted to all of the officers and teachers who were in daily contact with these boys and were asked to check any or all cases and to make a statement if the report was correct and accurate or not. As a result each and every report bears the signature of all officers and teachers stating that they have examined and checked these reports and have found same to be accurate and correct.

We have been able to accomplish results far beyond their fondest hopes and expectations in the rehabilitation of these boys. The teachers have voluntarily and without solicitation signed a petition asking for an all-time or full-time chiropractor in that institution.

As to the results obtained I submit a detailed report of each case which speaks for itself. In this report I show the age, symptoms, time patient started treatment and progress made and results obtained each three months until dismissal. I desire to especially call your attention to the improvement in school work and in behavior.

The physical condition of a boy is very largely responsible for his conduct and ability to advance in school work. You will notice that

54 of our patients have been promoted in grades and almost 100 per cent have shown improvement in conduct.

Paroles are based largely upon conduct and you will notice 144 of our 244 patients have been paroled since we have been giving them Chiropractic treatment. It cost the state about \$25.00 per month to keep a boy in the Kentucky Houses of Reform and at that rate 144 boys would cost the state \$43,200.00 annually. This saving could be increased very materially or I might say by several times the above amount in some of our larger institutions. As shown by this report this institution is the only one in the state that shows a decrease in the number of inmates during the past year and the only State Penal Institution in the country so far as I can ascertain, that shows a decrease over any period during the last ten years.

IT IS MUCH EASIER TO DECREASE THE EXPENSES OF OUR STATE PENAL AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS THAN TO RAISE REVENUE FOR THEM. The way to decrease expenses is by rehabilitation of those unfortunates and we have demonstrated beyond all shadow of doubt at The Kentucky Houses of Reform what Chiropractic will do toward rehabilitation and what can be saved by this method.

We desire to express our appreciation to the superintendent, officers and teachers of this institution for the splendid cooperation which they have given us in our work and they are to be highly commended for their interest shown and for their efforts and program of rehabilitating and restoring the boys to normal, physical, mental and moral beings, to assist them to find the straight and narrow path of life and to prevent them from becoming permanent wards of the state or confirmed criminals.

We believe that the results of our work as shown by this report and which has the testimony of those officers and teachers who have observed it thoroughly, justifies the Board of Charities and Corrections placing one or more qualified competent chiropractors in each of the state charitable and penal institutions.

Therefore we ask that you study this report carefully and seriously and we sincerely hope that before the close of this year every institution in Kentucky will have a competent, qualified chiropractor working with the medical staff on a great program of rehabilitation.

I feel that your work has materially aided and assisted us in our program of rehabilitation and I desire at this time to express my appreciation to you and to Dr. Combs for your cooperation and assistance given this institution.

Dear Mr. Haswell:—

I deem that in justice to myself and the Board of Charities and Corrections it is proper that I make a report on my year's work as Educational Director at the Greendale Kentucky Houses of Reform, (boys department).

Records at the Kentucky Houses of Reform (boys department) at Greendale, Ky., discloses that the average number of inmates for the last eighteen years has been 450. The average for 1928 was 474, 1929, 544, 1930, 520 and 1931, 455.

The average cost per month per inmate is about twenty-five dollars. On December 8, 1930 the date on which I went to Greendale there was about 540 inmates in the institution and on December 10, 1931 the date I left Greendale there were about 335 inmates, a decrease in number of inmates of approximately 200. If the number of inmates could be held at approximately this number, (there is no reason it cannot) the state would save between forty and fifty thousand dollars each year. I would not have you think this financial saving is to be considered paramount. It means much more to the social uplift and spiritual outlook of the boys concerned, in fact I deem the financial saving of little consequence when compared to the human side of the question.

There are two things absolutely essential to the proper rehabilitation of inmates of our penal institutions. First, we must know the individual to be rehabilitated; second, we must have persons trained in rehabilitation work.

In order to know the individual I deem there are four things essential, namely; we must know the criminal history of the individual, the physical condition of the individual, the family history of the individual and his mental reactions. During the year of my stay at Greendale I have worked upon this theory. We have gone thoroughly into the family history of the individual as far as we were able to go by personal interviews with each inmate, thereby learning something, in many instances meager, of the home life and the family condition of each boy. We have been exceptionally fortunate in determining the physical condition of the inmate. **IN ADDITION TO REGULAR PHYSICIANS EMPLOYED AT THE INSTITUTION WE HAVE HAD THE SERVICES OF CHIROPRACTORS. ALLOW ME TO SAY THAT I FEEL THAT THE FINE SHOWING IN THE NUMBER OF PROMOTIONS AND DISMISSALS FROM THE INSTITUTION IS LARGELY ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE VERY EXCELLENT WORK**

DONE BY THE CHIROPRACTORS WHO HAVE ALMOST DAILY LOOKED AFTER THE HEALTH AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THESE BOYS. THE GENERAL TONE. THE MENTAL ALERTNESS AND MORAL AND SOCIAL OUTLOOK OF THESE BOYS HAVE IN A LARGE MEASURE BEEN ATTRIBUTABLE TO THIS VERY FINE COOPERATION.

The criminal history of the inmates at Greendale is usually very short and is in most cases readily ascertainable from copies of court records and from the boys themselves.

In order to get the mental reactions of the boys we have used the Stanford Revision of the Simon-Binet Mental Tests. Each boy in the institution has been given a test of this kind and his educational as well as vocational work has been determined by the reaction from these tests.

Knowing these four things above mentioned is absolutely useless unless you have persons trained to carry out the work. The vocational and educational work must be so knit together that the one supplements the other. It is absolutely necessary that each man in charge of each vocation not only knows the particular vocation which he attempts to teach, but he must know adolescent psychology, at least the practical side of it. Men who are to have charge of these inmates should be selected solely upon their merits to train these boys and politics should play no part in the selection of the men in charge. An examination should be given each applicant and men selected from those passing with the highest grades.

The inmates of this institution do not ask for sympathy, they ask for a chance. At least 80 per cent of the boys of this institution are there because of physical and unfavorable family conditions. Corporal punishment should be the last thing resorted to because punishment never reforms anyone and it only deters cowards, not brave men.

1. Dr. Lillard T. Marshall and Dr. C. A. Combs, chiropractors, of Lexington, Kentucky, started work at the Kentucky Houses of Reform at Greendale, September 3, 1930.
2. Number of boys given Chiropractic adjustments up to Dec. 1st, 1931, 244.
3. Number of cases dismissed completely recovered or greatly benefitted, 155.
4. Of the 244 cases 89 are still under treatment.
5. Number of cases promoted in school grades 54.
6. Number of cases paroled 144.
7. Cost of keeping 144 boys one year approximately \$43,200.00.
8. Number of boys at Greendale (Kentucky Houses of Reform) at time we started our work approximately 540.
9. Number of Greendale (Kentucky Houses of Reform) Dec. 1st, 1931 approximately 335.
10. Approximate saving to state \$40,000.00 to \$50,000.00.
11. We recommend that the state give more attention to rehabilitation as a means of economy.
12. We recommend that the state give more attention to the Science of Chiropractic as a means of rehabilitation.
13. The only institution in the state that has shown a decrease in number of patients during the past ten years is the one which employed chiropractors.

Case No. 1
Age 17
Symptoms:
Epilepsy, headache and stomach trouble. Conduct fair. This case had been having one and two epileptic attacks each month during his confinement at Greendale.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
During the two months treatment he has not had a single attack of epilepsy, headache relieved, stomach trouble relieved and mental condition improved.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Still has not had a single attack of epilepsy during the period of treatment. Stomach trouble and headache entirely relieved. His teacher reports that he is 60 per cent better in school work. Conduct is also better.
Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Dismissed May 1st, 1931, completely recovered but still under observation.

Case No. 2
Age 17
Symptoms:
Very nervous and irritable, constant backache, school work very poor. Conduct fair.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
This case has improved remarkably in all symptoms. Conduct and school work much improved.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Nervousness entirely relieved. Backache entirely relieved. Conduct and school work continues to improve. Promoted from the 6th to the 7th grade.
Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Dismissed March 31 entirely recovered.
Paroled September 18, 1931.

Case No. 3
Age 17 Started treatment September 5, 1930.

Symptoms:
Headache, pains in eyes, nervous, irritable, very poor in school work. Conduct fair.

Results: Report No. 1, Dec. 1, 1930.
Case has shown general improvement in all symptoms. Headache entirely relieved, nervousness greatly improved and has shown decided improvement in school work. Conduct better.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Eyes feeling much better. Nervousness entirely relieved. A decided improvement in school, conduct improved. This boy has gained in weight and growth. While under treatment was promoted from the 4th to the 5th grade.

Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Dismissed March 3rd, 1931 completely recovered. Paroled May 29th, 1931.

Case No. 4
Age 19 Started treatment September 2, 1930.

Symptoms:
Difficult breathing, frequent headache and very poor school work. Conduct fair.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Difficult breathing entirely relieved. Headache decidedly improved. Has shown much improvement in school work. Conduct improved.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Headache entirely relieved. School work continues to improve, also conduct. Paroled in January, 8, 1931, completely recovered.

Case No. 5
Age 17 Started treatment September 2, 1930.

Symptoms:
Frontal headache, constant aching in back of neck, extreme soreness on right side of neck. Very nervous.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Dismissed October 23rd, 1930 with all physical symptoms completely relieved.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Started treatment again in November, 1930, to see if results could be obtained in school work. Dismissed again in March 1931 with a decided improvement in school work and completely recovered of all symptoms.

Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Paroled May 29, 1931.

Case No. 6
Age 14 Started treatment September 15, 1930.

Symptoms:
Under weight, constant headache and backache, very pale and anemic, soreness in eyeballs. Highly toxic condition.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Case is gaining in weight, color very much improved. Backache and headache completely relieved. Shows general improvement in every symptom.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Case continues to gain in weight, improvement of anemic condition, color continues to improve. Still has some soreness in eyeballs probably caused by lack of glasses. Dismissed March 2nd, 1931 decidedly improved.

Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Paroled May 29, 1931.

Case No. 7
Age 14 Started treatment September 15, 1930.

Symptoms:
Under weight, anemic, stomach trouble and very poor school work, conduct fair.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
This case is showing general improvement, anemia better, gaining weight, stomach trouble much improved. School work improved. Conduct much better.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Stomach trouble entirely relieved, anemia shows good improvement, gained in weight, school work decidedly better. Conduct good. Paroled on January 8, 1931, completely recovered.

Case No. 8
Age 16 Started treatment September 4, 1930.

Symptoms:
Pains in and around heart, severe pains in stomach and bowels, toxic condition and gas. Conduct bad, school work poor.

Result: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
This case shows much improvement, pains in heart, stomach and bowels relieved. School work and conduct much better.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Dismissed March 2nd, 1931 with all symptoms relieved. Paroled September 18, 1931.

Case No. 9
Age 15 Started treatment September 11, 1930.

Symptoms:
Vertigo, constant headache, nervousness, school work and conduct only fair.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
All symptoms relieved October 30, 1931, conduct and school work improved.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Conduct and school work continues to be better. Started taking treatments again November 11th, 1930 and was dismissed February 28, 1931, cured.

Case No. 10
Age 17 Started treatment September 4, 1930.

Symptoms:
Constant frontal headache, very nervous and irritable, school work very poor.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Headache almost entirely relieved. School work much improved.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Headache entirely relieved, nervousness relieved, irritability entirely relieved. School work shows a decided improvement. His teacher reports that he is 60 per cent better in school work. Dismissed March 3rd, 1931 with all symptoms relieved. During this period of treatment this boy was promoted from 1st to the second grade.

Case No. 11
Age 14 Started treatment September 5, 1930.

Symptoms:
Extremely nervous, frequent severe headache, conduct fair.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
This case has shown decided improvement, nervousness much improved, headache relieved, conduct exceptionally good, school work much improved.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Dismissed March 2nd, 1931 with all symptoms relieved. Conduct exceptionally good, school work improved. During period of treatment the boy was promoted from the 5th to the 6th grade.
Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Paroled May 29, 1931.

Case No. 12
Age 18 Started treatment September 15, 1930.

Symptoms:
Headache, backache, cold in head and chest.
Results: Report No. 1, 1930.
Took five treatments and was entirely recovered. Dismissed.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Paroled in May 29, 1931.

Case No. 13
Age 18 Started treatment September 6, 1930.

Symptoms:
Headache, pain under arm, conduct fair.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Dismissed October 29, 1930 with all symptoms relieved. Conduct good.
Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.
Paroled May 29, 1931.

Case No. 14
Age 14 Started treatment September 16, 1930.

Symptoms:
Backache, very nervous.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Backache entirely relieved, nervousness greatly improved. School work greatly improved.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
School work decidedly improved. Conduct shows great improvement. Case dismissed February 11, 1931. During period of treatment this boy was promoted from the 4th to the 5th grade. Paroled November 28, 1931.

Case No. 15
Age 14 Started treatment September 2, 1930.

Symptoms:
Frontal headache continually, very nervous, school work very poor. Conduct only fair.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Headache relieved completely, nervousness greatly improved. School work much improved. Conduct good.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Dismissed March 3, 1931 with all symptoms entirely relieved. School work and conduct much improved.
Paroled September 18, 1931.

Case No. 16
Age 16 Started treatment September 23, 1930.

Symptoms:
Cramps in bowels, colitis, headache and very nervous. Conduct fair, school work poor.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
Cramps in bowels relieved, headache much improved, less nervous, school work much better. Conduct better.
Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.
Headache entirely relieved. Nervousness entirely well, school work continues to improve, conduct better. Dismissed entirely well February 27, 1931.

Case 17
Age 10 Started treatment September 16, 1930.

Symptoms:
Nocturnal enuresis (bed wetting), involuntary voiding of urine in day time, very nervous, headache, school work very poor.
Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.
This case responded to Chiropractic adjustments very quickly. Involuntary voiding of urine stopped after second adjustment, bed wetting and headache entirely relieved. Has improved very materially in school work and conduct.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Dismissed February 11, 1931 with all symptoms entirely relieved and a decided improvement in school work. During treatment was promoted from the 2nd to the 3rd grade. Paroled November 28, 1931.

Case No. 18

Age 13 Started treatment October 3, 1930.

Symptoms:

Backache and kidney trouble.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

About two weeks adjustments relieved this case completely, trouble being caused from misplacement of one vertebra.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Backache entirely well, school work decidedly improved. Kidney trouble entirely relieved. Paroled Jan. 8, 1931.

Case No. 19

Age 13 Started treatment September 16, 1930.

Symptoms:

Intestinal pains and soreness. Intestinal indigestion causing a toxic condition.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

After six weeks treatment this boy's symptoms entirely disappeared and case was pronounced well.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Dismissed February 11, 1931 with all symptoms relieved, school work decidedly improved and conduct improved.

Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.

Paroled May 29, 1931.

Case No. 20

Age 13 Started treatment September 5, 1930.

Symptoms:

Under weight, under nourished, poor assimilation, low mentality, anemic, school work very bad, and conduct bad.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

This case is a very interesting one and has shown marked improvements. He has gained weight, assimilates his food much better and anemia shows marked improvement. The mental condition of this boy is improving and he is taking an interest in school work. His teachers say he shows a decided improvement.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Continues to show general improvement, continues to gain in weight, countenance very much better. Conduct good. This boy has been put on a special diet and is showing considerable increase in weight.

Results: Report No. 3, June 1, 1931.

Dismissed May 29th, 1931 with no further improvement.

Case No. 21

Age 11 Started treatment October 18, 1930.

Symptoms:

Constant headache and backache.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

Case dismissed October 30, 1930 with all symptoms relieved.

Case No. 22

Age 12 Started treatment October 8, 1930.

Symptoms:

Frequent urination, nocturnal enuresis (bed wetting), backache continually, extreme nervousness. Conduct good.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

After six adjustments nocturnal enuresis entirely relieved, frequent urination greatly improved, backache almost all gone, nervousness very much improved. School work improved.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Kidney trouble entirely relieved, frequent urination entirely relieved, conduct good, school work continues to improve. Paroled January 8, 1931.

Case No. 23

Age 14 Started treatment September 26, 1930.

Symptoms:

Weak eyes, pains in chest, (almost constantly), continual headache, conduct fair.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

Eyes are stronger, pains in chest entirely relieved and headache entirely relieved. School work improved. Conduct much better.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Pains in eyes decidedly improved. Conduct and school work continues to improve. Paroled January 8, 1931, completely recovered with the exception of the eye condition.

Case No. 24

Age 13 Started treatment October 3, 1930.

Symptoms:

Under weight, continual backache, poor school work. Conduct good.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

This case is gaining in weight, backache is relieved and he is improving in school work.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Backache entirely relieved, conduct good, school work improved, gained considerably in weight. Dismissed February 11, 1931 entirely well. Paroled in September 18, 1931.

Case No. 25

Age 16 Started treatment September 13, 1930.

Symptoms:

Continual pains in eyeballs, frequent headache, neuritis in right shoulder and arm. Conduct good.

Results: Report No. 1, December 1, 1930.

Pains in eyes greatly improved, headache greatly improved and neuritis entirely relieved. Decidedly improved in school work.

Results: Report No. 2, March 1, 1931.

Headache entirely relieved, eyes much improved, they only ache when reading. Still some improvement in school work. Has been impeded in school on account of needing glasses. Conduct good.

Dismissed February 11, 1931.

Paroled September 18, 1931.
